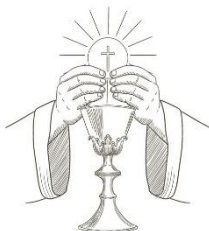

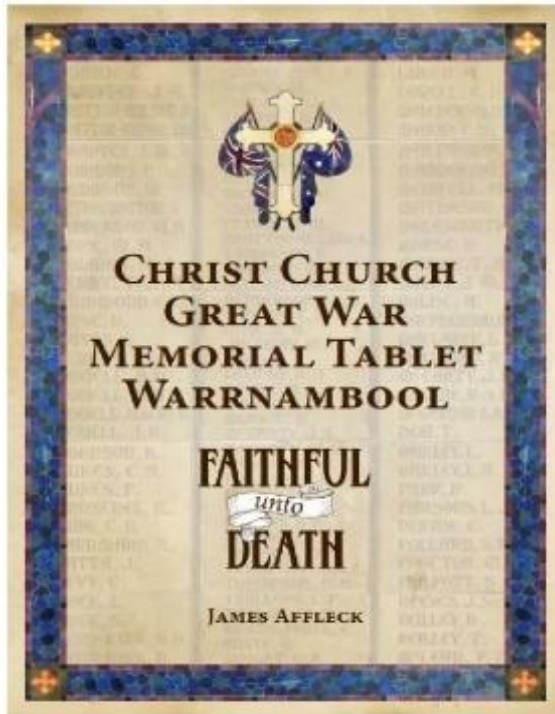

'But let justice roll on like a river and righteousness like a never-failing stream.' (Amos 5:24)

The prophet Amos, who said these famous words, was speaking to a religious people. They gathered, they sang, they offered sacrifices. But they did not walk as godly men and women. They neglected the commandments of the Lord, especially that we love our neighbours, not least by showing justice and righteousness. God's people need to live godly lives in our communities.
