Celebrating Mary's Birthday

Mary, the Mother of Jesus, has always occupied a special place in the hearts and devotional lives of various Christian Churches. Orthodox Christians revere her, celebrating her birthday as one of the 12 "Great Feasts" of the Orthodox Church. *Life* magazine estimated that the prayer "Hail Mary" is said two billion times every day, in various languages and for a variety of reasons.

It is very appropriate, then, in these times of great suffering and peril for humanity that we invoke Mary's nurturing presence and compassionate love.

"Begin any kind of activity with a prayer to Mary: a meal, a task of work, an exam, an athletic event, a doctor's appointment, a difficult meeting, and each time you leave the house or return.

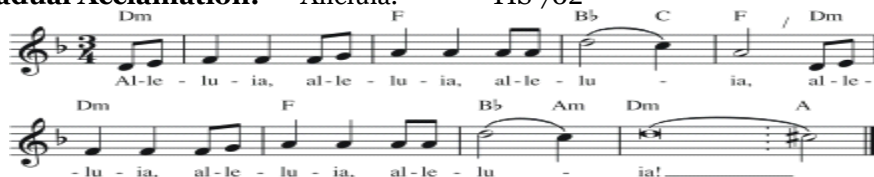

THE RANKEN FAMILY CHRISTENING BOWL

The Christening Bowl was brought from Scotland to Victoria by the Reverend Charles Jobson Lyon in 1846. He later came to live near Ballan when he purchased the property "Ballanee" in 1854. Charles was actively involved in the building of St John's Anglican Church in Ballan, with his wife Margaret (Playfair), laying the Church foundation stone in 1862.

The Bowl was then passed down to his son, George Lyon.

George married Kate Hill and their only son, Charles, died in Palestine in 1915 so the bowl was passed on to George's second daughter, Juliet May Lyon.

Aunt May (as she was known) never married so she gave the bowl to her oldest nephew William (Bill) Blackwood Ranken. Bill was the son of her younger sister Theodora (Dorothy) who married Richard Blackwood Ranken. It was Aunt May's request that the bowl be made available for the baptism of all Rankens.

Bill married Elizabeth Comey (Betty) and upon his death his son Arthur Blackwood Ranken became custodian of the bowl.

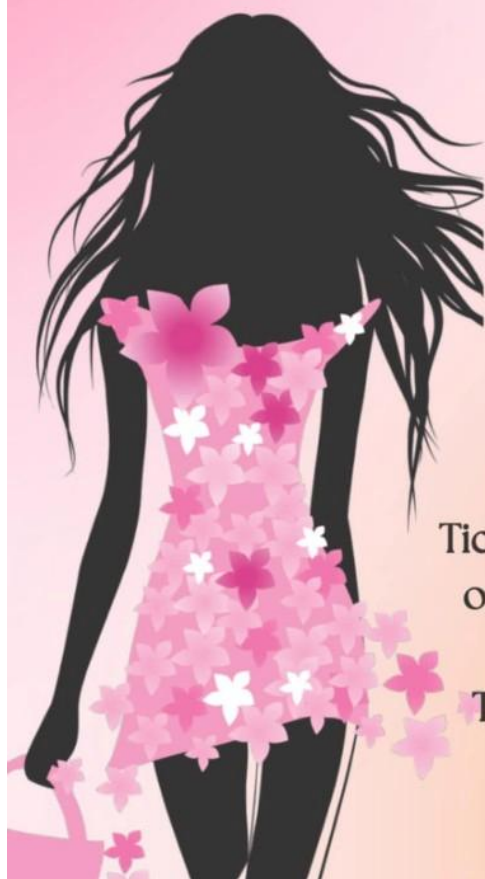
